

## **Sentencing Council Questionnaire on Dangerous Dog Offences**

### Introduction

The Sentencing Council is considering the development of new guidelines for the sentencing of dangerous dog offences. A guideline would aim to assist magistrates and judges to promote consistency. These guidelines would ultimately be issued as definitive guidelines to be inserted into the Magistrates' Court Sentencing Guidelines (MCSG) and for use in the Crown Court.

This questionnaire is being sent to a number of magistrates and district judges across England and Wales in order to help us understand the current decision making process relating to the sentencing of dangerous dog offences, and to canvass opinion. - The dog ran out in front of a 9 year old girl (the victim) who was cycling near some shops causing the girl to swerve.
- The owner pulled at the dog's lead in an attempt to regain control of it.
- The girl fell off her bicycle and while she was on the ground the dog bit her on the right thigh; it held on for about 30 seconds.
- The victim was very scared she saw two puncture wounds and blood coming from her leg through her trousers.
- Her injury was a gash to the leg treated with steri strips and a bandage. The wound healed but the victim was left with scarring.
- The defendant was convicted following a trial.
